

ORDINANCE NO. 17-22

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR, DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE, TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS AND TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR THE CLAREMONT AVENUE REHABILITATION PROJECT (PID 108743; ASD-CR5016-0.16) IN THE CITY OF ASHLAND, OHIO; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Claremont Avenue from Baney Road to Smith Road is in need of rehabilitation in order to provide for continued efficient and effective transportation infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, The City was awarded \$1,800,000 from the Ohio Department of Transportation's (ODOT) Small City Program for construction of said Project; and

WHEREAS, Council approved Resolution 10-20, which authorized the filing of an Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC) Local Transportation Improvement Program Grant Application for financing to assist with the Project; and

WHEREAS, the City was awarded an OPWC Local Transportation Improvement Program Grant in the amount of 14% of the Project costs not to exceed five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00); and

WHEREAS, that for the reason that said Project is immediately necessary to meet grant timelines and to provide for continued efficient and effective transportation infrastructure, this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare of said City of Ashland, Ohio; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Ashland, State of Ohio, five (5) members thereto concurring:

Section 1. That the Mayor, Director of Public Service be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to advertise for bids and to enter into a contract for the Claremont Avenue Rehabilitation Project in accordance with the plans and specifications on file in the office of the City Engineer.

Section 2. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to eliminate any or all of the above improvements from the above project if he shall determine that same shall be in the best interest of the City of Ashland.


Section 3. That the engineering estimate for said project is three million six hundred thousand three hundred twenty-two dollars (\$3,600,322). The OPWC Local Transportation Improvement Grant will provide four hundred thirteen thousand seven hundred ninety-six dollars (\$413,796) to be paid directly to the contractor by OPWC. The ODOT Small City Program Grant will provide one million eight hundred thousand dollars (\$1,800,000) to be paid directly to the Contractor by ODOT. The City's share of the project cost is estimated to be one million three hundred eighty six thousand five hundred twenty six dollars (\$1,386,526). Said money has been appropriated to be paid from Account No. 472-5601-56019.

Section 4. That the Mayor is authorized to enter into contract modification(s) not to exceed 10% of the actual contract cost for contingency items deemed necessary due to unforeseen existing conditions.



Section 6. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage by Council and approval pursuant to Section 12 of the Charter of the City of Ashland, Ohio.



RESOLUTION NO. 10-20

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE OF THE CITY OF ASHLAND, TO FILE APPLICATIONS AND ENTER INTO AGREEMENTS WITH THE OHIO PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING FUNDS THROUGH THE STATE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PROGRAM AND THE LOCAL TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM PURSUANT TO SECTION 164 OF THE OHIO REVISED CODE FOR THE COMPLETION OF CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS IN THE CITY OF ASHLAND, OHIO; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the State Capital Improvement Program and the Local Transportation Improvement Program both provide financial assistance to political subdivisions for capital improvements to public infrastructure; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Ashland is planning to make capital improvements involving the rehabilitation of Claremont Avenue from Baney Road to Smith Road (ASD-CR5016-00.16) and the reconfiguration of the existing Faultless Drive, Cottage Street, and US-250 intersection into a single lane roundabout (ASD-250-12.74); and,

WHEREAS, the City was awarded Ohio Department of Transportation Small City Grant Funds in the amount of two million dollars (\$2,000,000) and Ohio Department of Transportation Safety Funds in the amount of two million three hundred fifty two thousand dollars (\$2,352,000) to assist with funding said projects; and,

WHEREAS, the infrastructure improvements herein above described are considered to be priority needs for the community and are qualified activities under the Ohio Public Works Commission programs; and,

WHEREAS, this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety, and welfare, and for the further reason that the agreements are needed in order to secure funds for the completion of these projects for the convenience of the citizens of said City of Ashland, Ohio; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Ashland, State of Ohio, 5 members thereto concurring:

Section 1. That the Mayor of the City of Ashland, Ohio, is hereby authorized to apply for and, if awarded, enter into any agreements with the Ohio Public Works Commission as may be necessary and appropriate for obtaining financial assistance to complete said projects, as indicated in each application.



That for the reason that the agreements herein specified are immediately needed in order to secure funding for the completion of the projects for the convenience of the City of Ashland, Ohio, this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare of said City of Ashland, Ohio.

Section 3. That this Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage by Council and approval pursuant to Section 12 of the Charter of the City of Ashland, Ohio.
