Cooke Family Wildlife Conservation Park will be closed for deer-gun season (Nov. 30-Dec. 19-20) and for special hunts on October 2, 3, 9, and 16.

Upon completion of six hikes, all hikers (including babies in backpacks) will receive a **free hiking shield** that screws onto a hiking stick.
